As we sat around a fireside on the beach for our last night with the students and staff, Denver led us in our last communion time together and then the students had a time of sharing about their last 14 weeks of the course. Something that has been hard for me is the difference in not having my dad around. My dad was always so encouraging, loving, attentive, relational, and fun-loving. I sometimes have wondered how we can continue on to fill his shoes, expressing the incredible love that dad always gave so freely. I know we all love on these students while they're here, but sometimes I wondered if it was enough. That may sound weird and crazy, but something that has always made our course different and special is the love shown and the tight-knit family that it forms. As I listened to the students share about their time, over and over again love was mentioned, and one student in particular, Luis, shared how he didn't really believe in love, that he had never actually experienced unconditional love and doubted its existence...until CEC. Not only did he experienced Christ's love through the staff at CEC, but he came to realize just how much God the Father loves him. No strings attached, unconditional love.

As I sat there, tears began to stream down my cheeks. God continues to work and use the staff at CEC, even if my beloved dad is no longer with us. Once again, I'm reminded that it wasn't my dad's school or his ministry, but it is God's and it continues on. We are not perfect. It was a very intense course. CEC continues to be a place that gives not only tools for ministry, Gospel hope, Firm Bible-based foundations, but it is a place where hearts and characters are transformed because of a greater love and friendship with Jesus.
